COMMUNITY. THERE YOU WILL TURN LEFT
(WEST) ONTO FM 995 AND GO 2.6 MILES TO
COUNTY ROAD 2345. STATE HWY SIGN ON
LEFT SIDE OF 995 INDICATES FLOYD HILL
CEMETERY. CR 2345 IS A DIRT ROAD,
PROCEED ON THIS ROAD 2.6 MILES AND
CEMETERY WILL BE ON THE LEFT.

INTERSECTION OF HWY 77 AND 8, TAKE 8
SOUTH 4.8 MILES TO THE RED HILL

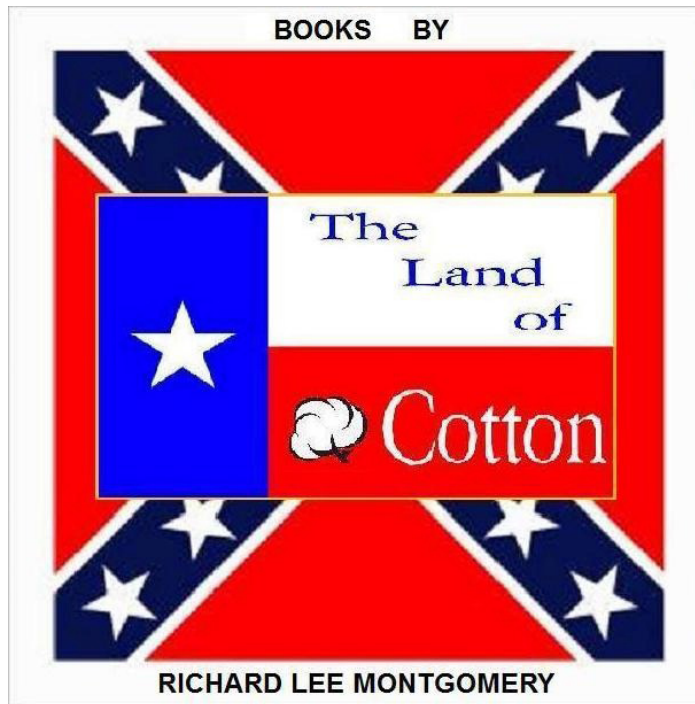
